## **The Bennington Writing Seminars: Master of Fine Arts in Writing and Literature**

Students may begin the Master of Fine Arts in Writing and Literature program during either of the 10-day residency sessions held in January or June. Admission is limited and competitive. The deadline for applications is September 1 for entering in January and March 1 for the June residency.

Students are admitted to the program primarily on the strength of the original manuscript submitted with the application, which will be judged according to its literary merit and its indication of a readiness to study writing and literature on a graduate level. The application should include three copies of the manuscript.

Although we encourage students to read and write broadly in fiction, nonfiction, and poetry, students will initially be accepted to work in one primary genre. The manuscript submitted should be in the genre in which the student intends to concentrate. Manuscripts cannot be returned.

Applicants should also provide a two- to three-page essay discussing their reading life and their engagement with the literature of other writers. Normally a bachelor's degree is required to gain admission, but this requirement can be waived if the quality of the work submitted warrants such an exception, though this may impact federal loan eligibility.

Students who are applying to the program will often have completed some graduate work or attained graduate degrees in various fields; no credits taken beforehand can be applied to the Bennington Writing Seminars. The low-residency format has its own internal logic and requirements, and in order to receive a degree a student must have completed the entire course of study.

In addition to the original manuscript and the essay, in admitting students we will give weight to previous education and work experience. We will look to see that a prospective student has the ability to work independently, to successfully utilize the low-residency format, and to benefit from direct criticism within the collaborative nature of the residency periods. Our aim is to provide a vortex for the person of letters and to be part of a lifelong continuum within the world of letters.

Transcripts from previous schools attended must also be submitted, along with recommendations from three people familiar with the student's writing and/or capacity to function independently and collaboratively.

Applications are considered complete when the following have been received:

- \$70 application fee** (non-refundable and cannot be waived).
- Application form** with supporting written materials.
- Three recommendations** from persons who are familiar with your writing and/or your ability to work independently and collaboratively (Appendix A).
- Official transcript** from each college or university you have attended.
- Essay:** A two- or three-page essay discussing your reading life and your engagement with the literature of other writers is required. Please submit three (3) copies.
- Writing Sample:** A manuscript of your work (20 to 25 pages of fiction or nonfiction, double spaced, in a readable font such as 12 pt. Times New Roman; 10 pages of poetry) must be submitted. Send three (3) copies, please.
- Financial Aid:** Graduate students who are U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens may use federal student loans to help finance their studies at Bennington. When applying for admission, interested students should complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the online Bennington College Application for Financial Aid. See Appendix B for aid application details and deadlines.

## APPENDIX B

### Financial Aid Checklist: The Bennington Writing Seminars

#### Types of Aid

The Bennington College Graduate Writing Seminars offers a number of small scholarships, which are awarded based on merit and need (no separate application is necessary).

Students needing financial assistance generally depend upon federal loans, which are available to U.S. citizens and eligible non-citizens who are not currently in default or owing a refund on previously received federal aid. Students may borrow up to the cost of education (the program residency charge, an allowance for transportation, loan fees, and required books and supplies), minus other aid received; they cannot borrow to cover costs of room and board during their non-residency period, and they cannot borrow to cover the final, residency-only, term.

**Unsubsidized federal student loans** are available to U.S. students who complete the FAFSA and other aid application materials. Borrowers enrolled at least half-time make regular interest-only payments, or make no payments while in school but instead add the interest due to the total amount borrowed (capitalizing the interest). The interest rate on new graduate federal student loans is fixed at 6.8%. Loan funds are disbursed near the beginning of the term and a fee of 1% is deducted before disbursement.

#### Applying

- 2013–2014 Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA)**—online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov).
  - Deadlines: April 1, 2013, for entry in June 2013; September 1, 2013, for entry in January 2014.
  - Before filing a FAFSA, get a **federal PIN** (or retrieve a forgotten one) from [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov) to use as your electronic signature.
  - Once you have a federal PIN, complete the **2013–2014 FAFSA at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov)**. Be certain to enter your social security number and driver's license correctly, as well as your name (and middle initial) as it appears on your social security card (FAFSA initiates a social security database match).
  - Use the FAFSA's IRS Data Retrieval tool if you have already filed your 2012 federal tax return.
  - List Bennington College, Bennington, Vermont—**college code 003682**—as a recipient.
- 2013–2014 Bennington College Application for Financial Aid**—online at [www.bennington.edu](http://www.bennington.edu), My Financial Aid
  - Deadline: As soon as possible after submitting a FAFSA.
  - Login with a Bennington aid student ID, (sent after application fee is paid).
  - Go to the “Apply Online” tab; an acknowledgement will pop up when it's successfully submitted.
- Federal Direct Loan Master Promissory Note and (if new borrower) Entrance Loan Counseling**
  - Completed online at <https://studentloans.gov>.
  - Use your FAFSA PIN as your login and signature

**After the award statement arrives, if you will attend Bennington:**

- Confirm IRS figures on FAFSA: If you did not use IRS Data Retrieval when first filing the FAFSA, you may do so later. Several weeks after your family has filed 2012 federal income tax returns, log into the FAFSA again, and authorize IRS Data Retrieval for tax return information.
- Accept, decline, or reduce the funds in your financial aid award online at **My Financial Aid**.
- Submit loan authorization and other forms (if required per **My Financial Aid**, Documents tab) directly to the Financial Aid Office.

- Inquire with your employer about financial assistance available for professional development.
- Check regionally for listings of state and local scholarships and the Directory of Foundation Grants to Individuals and similar resources.
