

Workshop Title: In The Stacks

Summary: Students will be given three citations which will lead them each to a book, an e-book, and a journal article. They will find a specific word within that resource, and when the words from all students are combined, will form a quote.

Locations: Crossett Library

Term: Fall

Specific Knowledge Outcomes:

- Students will understand how to “read” a citation.
- Students will be able to find an article and an e-book in our databases, and books in our catalog.
- Students will be able to use a call number to find a book in the library.

Activity: Each student will be given a sheet containing three citations, one for a book, one for a journal article, and one for an e-book. The citation will also contain directions to a specific page, line number, and word number. Students will then locate those three words in the appropriate resource and return to the conference room. When all the words have been located, they will be assembled into a quote. Alternatively, for larger classes, the students can be broken up into two or three teams who will work to complete their quote first. The quote can either be provided by the faculty member or pre-chosen by the librarian based on the size of the class and whether the faculty wants the class assembling as a whole or in teams.
