



## 2022 STUDENT GRANT COMPETITION

### CALL FOR PROPOSALS

Bennington College students are invited to submit proposals to the [2022 Davis Projects for Peace](#) program, which provides \$10,000 of grant funding for individuals in support of grassroots projects to promote peace and address root causes of conflict.

Projects must be implemented and completed during the summer of 2022 and can take place in the U.S. or any location around the world — *anywhere your idea to promote peace can make a difference*. Projects for Peace was created in 2007 through the generosity of [Kathryn W. Davis](#), a lifelong internationalist and philanthropist who died in 2013 at 106 years of age.

All current undergraduate students, including seniors, are eligible to apply. Group applications are accepted.

### TO APPLY

Proposals include a written statement of no more than two pages which describes the project (including need, goals, activities, timeline, and expected outcomes), and a one-page budget.

Applicants must secure the agreement of all parties and organizations involved in the project. Documentation of agreements made with such partners (emails confirming arrangements, letters of support, etc.) are welcome as appendices to the written proposal. Applicants are encouraged to submit a letter from a faculty member in support of the project.

### PROPOSAL SELECTION

A Bennington College Grant Committee will review proposals over the 2022 Field Work Term to select one nominee and one alternate; these two proposals will be submitted to the Davis Projects for Peace Program. The Program will announce their final award winners during the spring term, and the winning Projects for Peace will be implemented during summer 2022.
